



**SERVICE DESCRIPTION:** Early Intervention in Psychosis Service (EIP)

The citywide Early Intervention in Psychosis (EIP) Service offers specific pathways of care for those assessed / identified as experiencing At Risk Mental State (ARMS), First Episode Psychosis (FEP) and Suspected Psychosis. Each pathway will deliver a NICE concordant package of care for up to three years.

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## **1. ELIGIBILITY**

The selection criteria for the above Service are applicable to:

- All adults irrespective of gender, age (16 years of age or over), ethnicity, sexuality, culture or physical abilities
- People experiencing first episode psychosis (including psychosis associated with trauma or substance abuse) and those individuals identified as 'at high risk of developing psychosis'.

For those aged 14-16 the EIP Service offers advice, support and work in collaboration with the Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service who will remain the responsible team as per the Transitions Policy.

## **2. THE REFERRAL PROCESS**

Referrals are made via the Single Point of Access (SPA) for Adult Mental Health Services.

## **3. GEOGRAPHICAL POPULATION COVERED**

- The registered populations of NHS Sheffield Clinical Commissioning Group.
- People without settled accommodation who are resident in Sheffield.
